Bethlehem Bulletin Board



Ms. Margaret's Pre-School

This week in Ms. Margaret's Class the children continued to work on the letter H. As a review, they played Eye Spy to find the letters Aa-Hh. They really enjoy playing this game.

The children made observations of items a snowman would wear, ice and water. They observed an experiment where we made snow. They are matching numbers to quantities by matching mittens with numbers to mittens with dots on them and estimating how many bells are in each estimation jar.

The children have enjoyed listening to Snow Family by Daniel Kirk, The Snowman Storybook by Raymond Briggs, Snowballs by Lois Ehlert and If You Give a Moose a Muffin by Laura Joffe Numeroff.

Ms. Nancy's Pre-Kindergarten

It has been an exciting week in our classroom. After we read <u>The</u> <u>Elf on the Shelf</u>, an elf appeared in our class. The children named him Teddy Bear and every morning he moves to a different spot. It is a lot of fun watching the children look for him every morning. Mrs. Sibick's Multi-age Classroom

This week brought many fun and interesting learning opportunities. Students created an advent wreath. The Academy held two prayer services to "light," the two candles. The students are learning that the wreath has four candles, which stand for hope, peace, love and joy. This week Victoria Sulewski will present her science experiment. First graders will finish Unit 3-4 and will begin working in a new booklet for units 5-6. One activity the students completed was writing a poem which describes something they like. They did great! Second grade read more articles within the second magazine of Super. One article explained how magicians fool or trick the audience. First graders are working on adding doubles (4+4) and near doubles (4+5). They enjoy using the Smart board to write addition problems. Second grade is working on using symbols, (<>=) to finish the math sentence. Please continue to practice this at home. The students and I always have the alligator eat the bigger (greater) number, thus the alligator's mouth is always facing the bigger number. It's been a busy and productive week!
