

Ms. Margaret's Pre-School

This week in Ms.

Margaret's class the children are discussing different types of pet and made a chart to see which pet most students had, or want to have.

Ms. Kim's Kindergarten

This week kindergarten enjoyed thinking of things that begin with the letter A. They then drew pictures of these things to add to our picture of Abby Anteater. Abby only eats things that start with A, as in Alf. We added the pictures all around Abby Anteater. We have also been listening for the sound of A and O in the middle of words. as well as the beginning of words. In math, the kindergarteners have been very busy working on the concept of fewer than and how many fewer than. The second graders have begun learning about Reconciliation and how God forgives us for our sins.

Mrs. Sibick's Multi-age Classroom

November is going by just as fast as October! In Reading, first graders have begun their second booklet for Adventures of Superkids. They are learning pattern words (word families) and memory words (dolch sight words). Second grade will finish reading Nate the Great this week and next week will read issue 2 of the magazine Super. Students are practicing answering right there questions and search and find questions using these materials. These questions are part of the Q.A.R. (question answer relationship) and help train the brain to answer higher ordered thinking. In Math, first graders are writing subtraction sentences by drawing a picture and using part to whole relationship. Second graders are working on subtraction up to 18! Nicholas was our scientist of the week! The students enjoyed his experiment. Last Friday, was sadly Ms. Maja's last day. She had completed her 100 hours! The Academy was grateful for her time and talents. I will request Ms. Maja as a student teacher in January, so she might come back to The Academy! I will keep you updated.
